



Sports Premium Strategy 2023 – 2024

Impact of Sports Premium Funding at Buckton Fields, in 2023-2024:

Sport is a priority at Buckton Fields Primary School. We endeavor to provide rich sporting opportunities, develop talents and passion for sports and encourage our children to lead a healthy and active lifestyle.

- We took part in the EYFS, Year One and Year Two Trust Multi-skills, with children placing in top 10.
- Last year, we had a high engagement in extra-curricular lunch and after school activities throughout year groups.
- Our children thoroughly engaged in our enrichment opportunities, which led to strong pupil voice regarding these experiences.
- 83% of pupil premium children attend an extra-curricular sports club.
- Sports Day was staged off site successfully for all pupils.
- Transport to offsite sporting events and additional support from trust sporting lead enabled the pupils to participate in off-site activities.
- Lunch time equipment was purchased and updated based on pupil voice.
- To ensure high quality provision sports curriculum equipment was purchased and updated.
- New football kits were purchased in preparation for ks2 sporting events
